Taranaki sharemilker doing good for people and planet, with Meridian

"We're trying to be good role models. We want to make sure that everything we do

on farm is making a better future for the next generation. We don't want to bring the reputation of farmers down."

But she understands that it's easier said than done.

"This past year, I've found a sense of appreciation for those people who are working on farms, where the farm owner isn't interested in sustainability. Because it's really hard as a sharemilker and contract milker to want to do something too."
